PLEASE NOTE!

Certain heart pacemakers can become dangerously explosive when placed in a cremation chamber. The family and/or the funeral director in charge of the body shall be held responsible for any damages to the retorts resulting from a pacemaker and the crematory will not be responsible or accept any liability. Therefore the crematory will not accept bodies from which pacemakers have not been removed. **The crematory will also not allow artificial limbs or any foreign material such as plastics, fiberglass, etc. to enter the cremation chambers.**

The Proprietors of the Pittsfield Cemetery furthermore reserve the right to refuse to cremate any body encased in an unsuitable or incombustible container, or if objects are placed within the container that could be dangerous to the crematory retort or the operator.
